FACT SHEET

Application Process:

The first step in the process is completing our full application packet, which includes general information, terms and conditions, consent for release of information, a DD 214 copy, and a background check consent form.

All required paperwork can be mailed with an SASE to the requesting person, or downloaded from our website, www.operationdeltadog.org

Selection Criteria:

While our aim is to help as many veterans as we can, we do need to make sure that each applicant is able to fully commit to the process and is in a position to successfully bring a dog into their lives. In order to be considered, veterans should meet the following criteria:

- Have an official diagnosis from a health care provider of PTSD and/or TBI
- Reside within a 30-mile radius of Hollis, New Hampshire
- Be able to commit to the full training process (often one year to eighteen months), which may include a combination of two or more group classes per week, in-home individualized training sessions, and self-directed at-home training.
- If residing with others, one must have their complete support in obtaining a service dog.
- Have the ability to care for both self and their service dog.

Approval Process:

The approval process can typically take 4-8 weeks, although unique needs can impact this time frame. This process includes:

- Application review
- Background check
- Initial in-person interview in our Hollis, New Hampshire location
- Home visit to assess the suitability of the environment for a service Dog

Once the home visit is completed, the team will review all the information and make a final decision.
