Commander Norris addressed the resolution submitted on Saturday by Delegate Huge Lee, Post 1617, He ruled it not in order as the proposed resolution already is codified in the Department Bylaws (Article X, Section 3) and the National Bylaws (Sec 518 (a) (4) (J)).

Being no further business we moved on to the Joint Installation.

After the installation Hats and Pins were presented and placed. Incoming Commander and President made their brief remarks.

Chaplain Andy Corrow gave the benediction.

Commander Norris and President McCabe jointly Closed the Convention

(ENCL-1)

To: The Delegates of the 102<sup>nd</sup> Annual Department Convention, Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States, Department of New Hampshire.

Your Committee on Convention Rules with ---3--- members present met at the Town and Country in Shelburne NH and agreed on the following recommendation which are respectfully submitted for your considerations.

1. That, with the exception noted below, Roberts Rules shall be recognized as the parliamentary authority for this convention.
2. That, when a desire to make a motion or address the Convention he or she shall rise, address the Chair, as "Comrade Department Commander" and state his or her name and Post number before proceeding.
3. That, the debate be limited to Ten minutes each for each speaker.
4. That, a delegate shall be permitted to speak but twice on a single subject, or any pending resolution, except by consent of two thirds of the voting strength of the Convention present, except that the Chairman of the Convention Committee may speak as often as is necessary in Connection with reports of their committees, and that in the event of a controversy the presiding officer shall not entertain any motion which will curtail further debate without affording the maker of the motion or a member of the particular group presenting the resolution an opportunity for final rebuttal.
5. That, all resolutions offered on the floor at the Convention or otherwise, shall be in writing, automatically and without reading, be referred to a committee for a report.
6. That, no person not a duly accredited delegate or member of the Department Convention shall participate in debate, directly or indirectly, in a viva voce on any subject before the Convention.
7. Voting: The delegate or delegates of a Post present at a meeting of the Department Convention shall be entitled to vote the full strength to which the Post is entitled. Should there be a division among the delegates, the delegates present shall cast their pro-rata share of the total voting strength of the Post. For purposes of this section a Post Commander shall be considered a delegate.
8. That, on roll calls, the Chairman or acting Chairman on each delegation shall poll his delegation on the floor and shall announce the vote on his delegation.
9. Delegations may arrive at a vote in any manner they see fit but shall announce it in terms of full units and not in terms of a fractional part of a voice.
10. When the report of the Chairman of the delegation is not acceptable to all members of the delegation and a poll of the Department delegate of said Department, the Adjutant shall poll the delegates without discussion of the question.
11. Voting shall be by acclamation, except when a roll call can be demanded by three (3) delegates representing three (3) different Posts in the Department.
12. Nominating speech for the Department Officers shall be limited to five minutes each, not more than one seconding speech will be made for any candidate and such speech shall not exceed two minutes, nomination of Department Officers will be held according to the National Constitution and By-Laws, Article 5, Section 516.
13. Delegates and persons recognized by the chair shall be entitled to a respectful hearing and the chair shall have the authority to clear the gallery of the floor or have the Sergeant at Arms escort from the floor any persons who may create any disturbances which interferes with the orderly procedure of the Convention.
