- 2) PUBLIC SERVANT AWARD CITATIONS FOR EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIANS, LAW ENFORCEMENT PERSONNEL, FIREFIGHTERS AND DISPATCHERS Each year, the Veterans of Foreign Wars selects emergency medical technicians, law enforcement and firefighter personnel to receive VFW Public Servant Awards. New this year, the dispatcher category has been added. Post Safety Chairmen are encouraged to submit a candidate for these awards to their Department Headquarters by Jan. 1.

- 6) Attention of all members is directed to Section 901 of the National bylaws, "Discipline of Members." Members who have committed offenses recognized by the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States may be subject to disciplinary action. Members are reminded that acts of Sexual Harassment, Racial or Sexual Discrimination, and all other conduct prejudicial to good order and discipline or conduct determined to be unbecoming of a member will not be condoned. In general, harassment and discrimination consist of any form of verbal, non-verbal, or physical conduct that is sufficiently severe and/or pervasive enough to have the purpose or effect of creating an intimidating, hostile, or offensive environment or otherwise interfering with another's ability to participate in VFW events. All members will be treated with dignity and respect.

- 7) ONLINE REPORTING: For Online Reporting, go to https://nh.vfwportal.net/public/, your sign on is your Post number and your password is abc123 all lower case, it will never change. Example: Sign On: 3041 Password: abc123. Community Service reporting should be done on the dashboard on OMS, Post QM, ADJ and Commanders have access.
- 8) REQUEST FOR DEPARTMENT REPRESENTATIVE: Request for a Department Representative for a special event, must be submitted in writing to the Department Adjutant, PO Box 955, Concord, NH 03302-0955 or e-mail: nhvfwstateheadquarters@gmail.com

Several years ago, the phrase "To foster true patriotism through historical and education programs," was added to this section. This allows the Post to use the relief funds for the Voice of Democracy program or other Americanism programs that are educational. This does not include Post building projects, hall remodeling, color guard uniforms or any other expenditure that does not follow these guidelines.

DEPARTMENT OF NEW HAMPSHIRE VFW SURGEONS MESSAGE - DEC 2022

Greetings comrades, as we head into colder times it is important to know that there are some surprising health benefits of cold weather. Although cold weather is often associated with health issues such as cold and flu, you may be surprised to know the cold has some health benefits.

Fewer Allergies: Plants and trees don't make pollen in the winter, so allergy sufferers generally feel better in the cold weather.

Less bug-borne disease: Insects like mosquitoes and ticks are hard to find in cold weather, greatly reducing our risk of catching the nasty disease they may carry.

Reduced inflammation: cold weather can reduce inflammation and pain. People that exercise in the cold temperatures recover faster from workouts. This suggests that working out in the winter cold may result in less inflammation and soreness than in the summer.

Brain function: (VETERANS PAY ATTENTION) There's evidence suggesting our brains work better at cooler temperatures. A study has found that people study better when it's cold.

Increased fat burn: besides your body using more calories to stay warm, research suggests being cold can increase your ability to burn more fat. Exercising in cold weather boosts your body's energy for hours afterwards, so you end up burning more calories.

Better enthusiastic health: We are less likely to be out and about in cold weather, causing us to spend more time with family and friends. Social interactions like these have been shown to reduce stress, making us more relaxed and happier.

Five tips for winter wellness: 1 Take the time for extra sleep

2 Get outside and exercise

3 Stay social

4 Eat protein at each meal

5 Focus on fruits and vegetables

PUBLIC SERVANT AWARD CITATIONS FOR EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIANS, LAW ENFORCEMENT PERSONNEL, FIREFIGHTERS AND DISPATCHERS

Each year, the Veterans of Foreign Wars selects emergency medical technicians, law enforcement and firefighter personnel to receive VFW Public Servant Awards. New this year, the dispatcher category has been added. Post Safety Chairmen are encouraged to submit a candidate for these awards to their **Department Headquarters by Jan. 1**. The Department must select a single candidate for each of the four awards and submit those to **VFW National Headquarters by Feb. 1**.

VFW National Emergency Medical Technician Public Servant Citation:

Any individual, who actively gives emergency medical treatment, provides rescue service or civil disaster assistance as a member of any public or volunteer company organized to give emergency medical care, provide rescue and civil disaster assistance to our nation's citizens.

VFW National Law Enforcement Public Servant Citation:

Any individual who serves in a municipal, county, state or federal unit tasked with enforcement of the laws pertaining to their area of responsibility. This award does not apply to individual employed by private companies or security services.

VFW National Firefighters Public Servant Citation: Any individual who actively fights fires as a member of any public or volunteer company organized to fight fires and give assistance to our nation's citizens.

VFW National 911 Dispatcher Public Servant Citation:

Any individual who serves in a municipal, county, state or federal unit tasked with providing the vital link between callers in distress and emergency response teams by obtaining essential information to send the appropriate responders to the right location.

Criteria for these awards – Candidates must have demonstrated:

- 1) Recognition by their colleagues or those they serve.
- 2) Consistent excellence in the performance of their duties.
- 3) Consistent dedication to their official responsibilities over a period of years and continuous growth in responsibilities and skills within their profession.

Documentation required for all Candidates:

- 1) Public Servant Award Citation Post Entry Form
- 2) Nomination letter containing the candidate's name, title, address, telephone and identifying the award for which the individual should be considered.
- 3) Include justification outlining background in field, accomplishments and awards.
