As we start the new administrative year, We need to buckle down and get our paperwork in order. Some Posts are not following through with the 990's, Articles of Incorporation etc.

990's are to be filed every year rather you do the ecard or the long form.

Every Post and District must be incorporated and should review and restate every 5 years.

If Posts and Districts have bylaws, they should also review and update every 5 or so years.

We have had Posts not file the State required paperwork, A-9, A-12's for Property owning Non Profits (attached) because "they have never done that before" or "their accountant told them they do not need to file those". Both reasons are wrong, state law is very clear to keep your property tax free you must file both forms with your town.

It is permissible to use an accountant to do the books BUT that doesn't relieve the Commander or the Quartermaster from their responsibilities of making sure that documents are filed properly.

Greeting and Salutations from the Senior Vice Commander...

It is the start of Term 2022-2203 and Thank You for your support!

It was great to see everyone who attended the VFW Department Convention in Shelburne, NH.

I attended the 102nd Massachusetts State Convention June 10-11 2022 and conveyed congratulations to the incoming officers of the ensuing year from New Hampshire, and networked with many of our counterparts. It was a worthwhile experience and found that many of our neighbors to the south hold New Hampshire in high esteem from having lived, worked, and enjoyed the company of many VFW friends here in our state.

Some of the latest news...

Members of the U.S. Senate have announced that they will not approve nominees to the Asset and Infrastructure Review (AIR) Commission. Without the Senate's approval of the nominees, no Commission will be established and the process as outlined by the *VA MISSION Act* will not move forward. Earlier this year the Department of Veteran Affairs had released their recommendation on the future of the VA Healthcare System, which included closing VA clinics in Littleton and Conway, and moving outpatient surgical care from the Manchester VA Medical Center to community providers.

On June 16th, H.R. 3967, the Sergeant First Class Heath Robinson Honoring Our Promise to Address Comprehensive Toxics Act of 2022, known as the Honoring Our PACT Act, passed in the U.S. Senate. Procedural issues have delayed the finalization of the landmark toxic exposure as the bill heads back to U.S. House of Representatives for a re-vote before it goes to the White House for President Biden's signature. The legislation approves nearly 300-billion dollars for expanded veteran medical coverage for on-duty toxic exposures and it would also help older veterans of the Vietnam War era.

July 15-21 2022 - VFW 123rd & Auxiliary 109th National Conventions This will be our first <u>full</u> convention since COVID-19; we will be heading back to Kansas City, Missouri, the hometown of the VFW National Headquarters. Convention delegates also elect new leadership, as well as recognize prominent individuals and organizations for their support of veterans and military personnel. I hope to see many of you there!

As a reminder, the VFW is providing grants that are exclusive to VFW Posts and Auxiliaries for qualifying service projects. VFW #StillServing Community Support Grants have been designed to aid VFW Posts and Auxiliaries with projects that support, enrich and give back to their communities. The application period is open and will close on **July 31, 2022**. Eligible applicants may apply for up to \$1,000 each at VFW.org; please log in first, then cut & paste: https://vfw.org/community/community-initiatives/post-grants

There is a lot of work to do, and you make it happen each and every day, as we take care of our veterans and their families. Thank you for all you do!




Commanders Membership Program:

Every Post Commander and Quartermaster who meets or exceeds the minimum standards by June 30, 2023, will be considered for the title of All State Commander and Quartermaster. Each member of the All-State Post Commander and Quartermaster team will receive an official "All-State Post Commanders and Quartermaster's Cap" with Lapel Pin. (White hats will not be handed out until the Department outing in August 2023).

Minimum Requirements for Judging:

- Posts <u>must have an active Facebook page</u>.
 - That page must be updated at least weekly with reposts from the national postings and local community goings-on. This is tracked on the National Dashboard.
- Posts must be at least <u>102%</u> in membership to qualify.
- Each Post must recruit and/or Reinstate members so that the Post earns <u>102%</u>.
- Posts must report in all Programs, total reports must exceed <u>150</u>.
- Posts must have a 10% increase in total impact in Community Service. (\$ Donated + Hours = Total Impact) * Baseline has been established within the KPI Tools for Community Service.
- Must purchase 2 new life membership from the National Home (\$50.00 each)
- Post must purchase at least **1000** Poppies, or the number purchased in the previous year, whichever is greater.
- Post must be in compliance with the National By-Laws and Manual of Procedure.
- Posts must <u>participate</u> (i.e., submit a package for competition, in at least 1 category) in Voice of Democracy (VOD), Patriots Pen (PP), and National Teacher of the Year program. There is NO "buyout" option in lieu of submitting a competing package.
- Posts must participate (i.e., hold a competition and present an award) for the Police, Fire, and EMT of the year programs.
- The Post must make all Department contributions by <u>October 31st, 2022</u>.
- Posts must be 25+ members to qualify for All State.
- All Post Officers (CDR, SVC, JVC, QM, and ALL Trustees) must attend at least 1 OTI session. The OTI will be held in four different locations with one central catch up session. Some OTI's will be simulcast via ZOOM to increase proliferation of the training.
- Posts must have a minimum retention rate of <u>90% as of June 30th</u>, <u>2023.</u>
